United Health Foundation and Colorado Center for Nursing Excellence: Addressing the Behavioral Health Workforce Shortage in Rural Colorado

In 2019 the United Health Foundation, the philanthropic arm of UnitedHealth Group, and the Colorado Center for Nursing Excellence announced a three-year, \$1.5 million grant partnership to address the shortage of mental health providers in rural Colorado communities. Nine of the 10 Colorado counties with the highest drug overdose death rates are rural counties, and the average suicide rate in rural Colorado is 40% higher compared to state-wide rates.

The program recruited 40 rural Advanced Practice Registered Nurse Behavioral Health Fellows to return to graduate school and earn a Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (PMHNP) certificate. Fellows received financial stipends, monthly coaching and support in securing their required 500+ hours of behavioral health clinical practice, as well as additional support services to ensure they successfully completed the certificate program. Once certified, the 40 PMHNPs began to provide behavioral health care services for a minimum of two years in rural areas, increasing rural clinics' behavioral health care services capacity by 25%.
